## TERMS OF PARENT CONDUCT

## Real Brazilian Soccer Experience - (61) 285-3349

Achieving a high level of sport for our players starts with parents. One of your responsibilities as a parent or guardian is to conduct yourself in a way that reflects positively on yourself, your child, your child's team, your family, and the soccer game.
Parents who do not behave properly will be subject to disciplinary sanctions that can strike a practitioner. We all depend on good conduct to set a good example for our players, spectators, employees, and competition organizers.

Below are the behaviors expected from parents, guardians of students and players.

1. I will learn to follow the laws of the game at all times.
2. I will remember that the game is for players and not for adults.
3. Charging instructions makes my child learn, but it can be the opposite of what the coach will tell you and this can prevent you from making your own decision.
4. I will not use foul or inappropriate language when participating in football activities.
5. I will make sure my child arrives on time for all training and games. I will notify the coach well in advance, whenever there is a problem participating in a scheduled event.
6. I will not shout directions and instructions from outside. I'll let the coach do that.
7. I will respect the opposing team and not cause or seek any confrontation.
8. I will respect the game officials and make no comments on the outside about decisions made on the pitch.
9. I'm just going to shout or say words of encouragement outside and I'm going to cheer for everyone.
10. I will not incite any behavior that endangers an athlete's health.
11. I will value the development of skills, fair competition, and the effort of each one.
12. I will respect the decisions made by the coaches regarding lineup, positioning of players on the field and / or any other measure related to the assembly of a team. If there is no fixed goalkeeper, for example, any practitioner can be assigned to the role, respecting a relay criterion. EVERYONE must be able to be a goalkeeper!
13. I will accept a disciplinary sanction adopted by coaches for conduct that is considered inappropriate, whether done by me (parent / guardian) or by an athlete.
14. I will speak to the coach in private and not in front of others if problems arise.
